
Prevention and Management of Violence: Guidance for Mental Healthcare Professionals

- ▶ The Royal College of Psychiatrists has this year published a new book “Prevention and Management of Violence: Guidance for Mental Healthcare Professionals” which was edited by Dr Dominic Beer and Dr Masum Kwaja, with contributions from staff from various other professions as part of an expert working group from general adult, forensic, other adult, learning disability specialties. Although it is a book, it is an update from an older Royal College of Psychiatrists “Council Report” and so the guidance is official policy recommended by RCPsych.
- ▶ It provides a comprehensive overview of best practice across a wide range of aspects of care and will be a practical use to a wide range of mental health professionals working in community, in-patient or prison settings
- ▶ In addition to the expected topics it also covers sensitive issues such as violence in patients from minority ethnic backgrounds, preserving patients’ dignity in highly volatile situations as well as ways to apply physical restraint safely, and the use of medication in the short term and long term management of violence.
