


About NAPICU








NAPICU website


- NAPICU website has approx. 200-300 hits per month.

- Discussion board open to all to exchange information and debate.















Psychiatric Intensive Care (2nd Ed)


What is AIMS/PICU


- AIMS/PICU is a joint venture between the NAPICU and the Royal College of Psychiatrists Centre for Quality Improvement (CCQI)

- The new standards have been drawn up from review of relevant literature.


