At the launch of the [NAPICU Occupational Therapy Network](#) in March this year in London, it was established that there is a need for occupational therapists to gain knowledge on and use published and/or standardised occupational therapy assessments and outcome measures. Their importance is not only to enhance the quality of occupational therapy provision but to enable therapists to articulate and demonstrate its value.

NAPICU is delivering a one-day CPD event on two approaches to occupational therapy assessment and outcome measurement utilised in PICUs:

- The **Creative Participation Assessment** (Van der Reyden, 2019) and **Activity Participation Outcome Measure** (Casteleijn, 2010), both from the Vona du Toit Model of Creative Ability (Van der Reyden et al, 2019)
- The **Occupational Therapy Task Observation Scale** (OTTOS) (Margolis et al, 1996)
