Dr Hamid Alhaj

Hamid is an Associate Professor, Consultant Psychiatrist and Head of the Department of Family Medicine and Behavioural Sciences at the University of Sharjah, United Arab Emirates. He is Director of Research for the National Association of Psychiatric Intensive Care Units (NAPICU). He has worked in the UK for over 20 years, both academically and clinically and his most recent roles included being PICU Consultant Psychiatrist and Director of Medical Education at Sheffield Health and Social Care NHS Foundation Trust, PLAB Examiner for the General Medical Council (UK) and Foundation Training Programme Director for Health Education England.

Dr Daniel Whiting

Daniel Whiting is a clinical academic forensic psychiatrist based in Nottingham. He is interested in the epidemiology of violence in mental illness and clinical prediction models, particularly how they might best be validated and clinically translated as clinical support tools in psychiatry. He completed his PhD as part of an NIHR Doctoral Research Fellowship, which involved developing approaches to improve violence risk assessment and intervention in first episode psychosis. He works clinically in prison mental health services.



Dr Noor Majed AlMheiri

Dr. Noor Majed AlMheiri is the Director of Mental Health Department & visiting consultant program in Emirates Health Services. She was leading Medical services unit in Hospitals department, EHS (2016-2020). She is a graduate of the UAE University Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences obtaining her MBBS in 2010 and graduated with honor ranking in the top of Dean's list. She is a Consultant family physician who completed her Arab Board Medical Specialization in Family Medicine in 2016. She is a member of the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) and Royal collage of General practitioner (MRCGP). She has completed a Master in Health Care Management at the Royal Collage of Surgeon Ireland (RCSI) and graduated with First class honor (2014). In 2020, She got her Public Innovation Diploma from Mohammed Bin Rashid Center for government innovation in partnership with Cambridge University. She has led a number of clinical projects in EHS hospitals such as Newborn screening, Telemedicine outpatient service, community mental health program and Clinical excellence and accreditation programs. Asif has held various managerial and digital positions in NHS and independent sector including Clinical Director, Associate Medical Director, Clinical Lead for Mental Health Outcomes and Chief Clinical Information Officer. Due to his interest in mental health outcomes, Asif was also the NHS London Clinical Lead for Mental Health Outcomes for 2 years (2017-19). Asif has co-authored various policy documents and papers around data and digital include NHS London HoNOS analytical framework and HLP Development of Primary Care MH Models. Asif was co-author of the two-part series in RCPsych Advances (2022) on Digital literacy in contemporary mental healthcare.
